

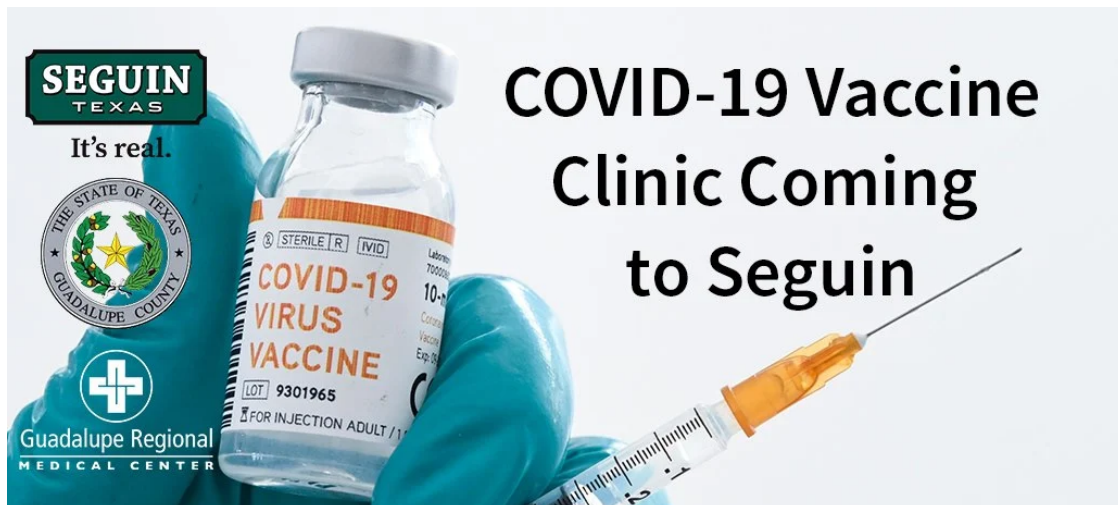

COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic



Guadalupe Regional Medical Center, Guadalupe County and the City of Seguin are partnering together to host a series of COVID-19 vaccine clinics this week. The Texas Department of State Health Services has allocated 5,000 Moderna vaccine doses to our community.

COVID-19 vaccines will be administered free of charge at the Seguin Coliseum, located at 950 S. Austin Street in Seguin, from 9 am to 5 pm on Wednesday, Feb. 3rd, Thursday, Feb. 4th, and Friday, Feb. 5th.

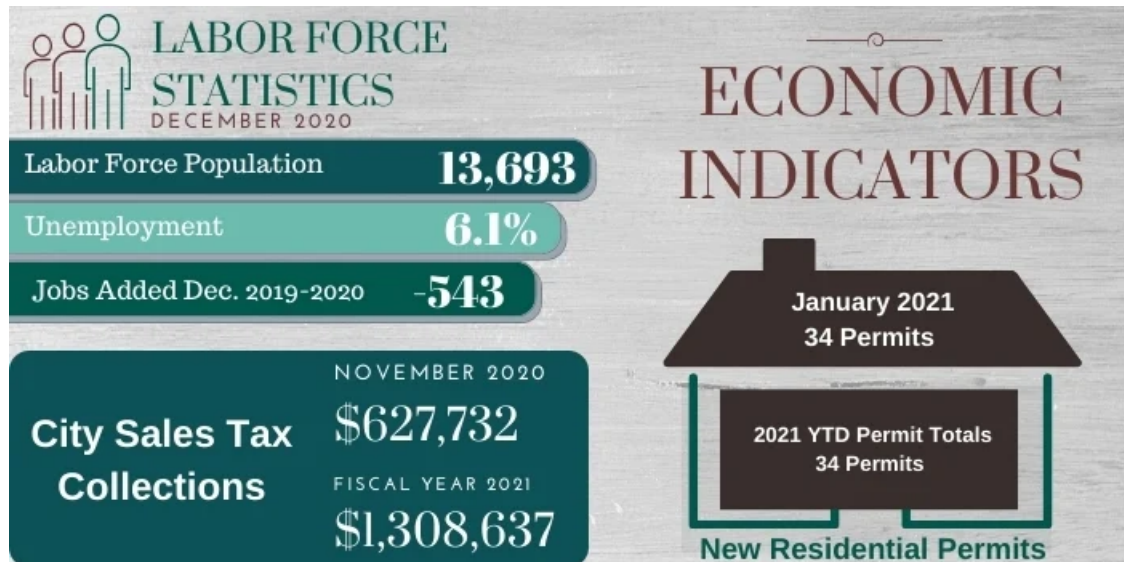
Vaccines will be distributed to individuals, per State guidelines, who fall under phases 1A and 1B. These are the only populations eligible to be vaccinated at this time.

Appointments are required and can be made by registering online at the following link when it goes live tomorrow morning, Feb. 2, at 9 am: [Seguintexas.gov/covidvaccine](https://seguintexas.gov/covidvaccine) or by calling the Guadalupe County COVID-19 Vaccine Call Center at 830-303-9701. Walk-ins will not be accepted. Those with appointments are required to bring a driver's license or other form of photo identification with them to the clinic.

If you are unable to get an appointment at the vaccine clinics at the Seguin Coliseum, you can also try securing an appointment at another area vaccine clinic happening this week. The City of Schertz is also conducting a COVID-19 vaccine

clinic from 8 am to 5 pm on Thursday, Feb. 4 for 1A and 1B recipients. The clinic is being held at the Schertz Civic Center located at 1400 Schertz Pkwy in Schertz, TX. **Appointments are required and can be made by registering online at the following link when it goes live tomorrow morning, Feb. 2, at 9 am: [Schertz.com/covidvaccine](https://www.schertz.com/covidvaccine) or call the Schertz COVID-19 Vaccine Hotline at (210) 619-1990.**

That's a big number, but the Biennial Revenue Estimate (BRE) — released on Monday by State Comptroller Glenn Hegar — is actually much better than what most state lawmakers had expected. San Antonio Economic Indicators

In November 2020, the San Antonio Business-Cycle Index contracted following its rebound in October. Overall, the pattern suggests a sharp slowing in the recovery since August. The unemployment rate increased sharply in November, while job growth was positive but weak. Local consumer spending improved in mid-November and early December, and the number of small businesses open increased briefly around the Thanksgiving holiday. Office space demand improved somewhat in the fourth quarter. [Read More](#)
