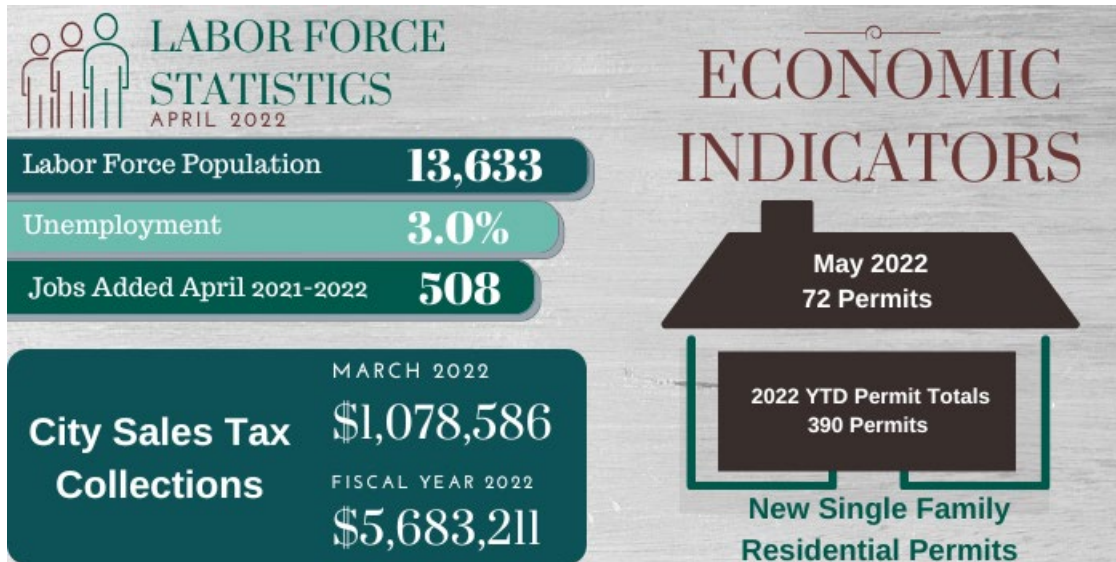

Texas Manufacturing Growth Picks Up, but Some Weaknesses Emerge

Texas factory activity expanded at a fairly robust pace in May, according to business executives responding to the Texas Manufacturing Outlook Survey. The production index, a key measure of state manufacturing conditions, rose from 10.8 to 18.8, signaling an acceleration in growth from April. [Read More](#)

San Antonio Economic Indicators

Broad measures of the San Antonio economy remained positive in April, though some indicators moderated. The San Antonio Business-Cycle Index increased despite a slight uptick in the metro unemployment rate. Annualized net job growth over the three months ending in April held positive, though the pace of growth slowed from last year's rate. Wages in San Antonio declined, although wage growth has outpaced the state and national averages over the past 12 months. Home affordability increased in the first quarter this year, and population growth in 2021 rebounded close to its pre-pandemic pace. [Read More](#)
