Texas FAME Lone Star Chapter and Texas State Technical College Partner to Create Regional Workforce Pipeline



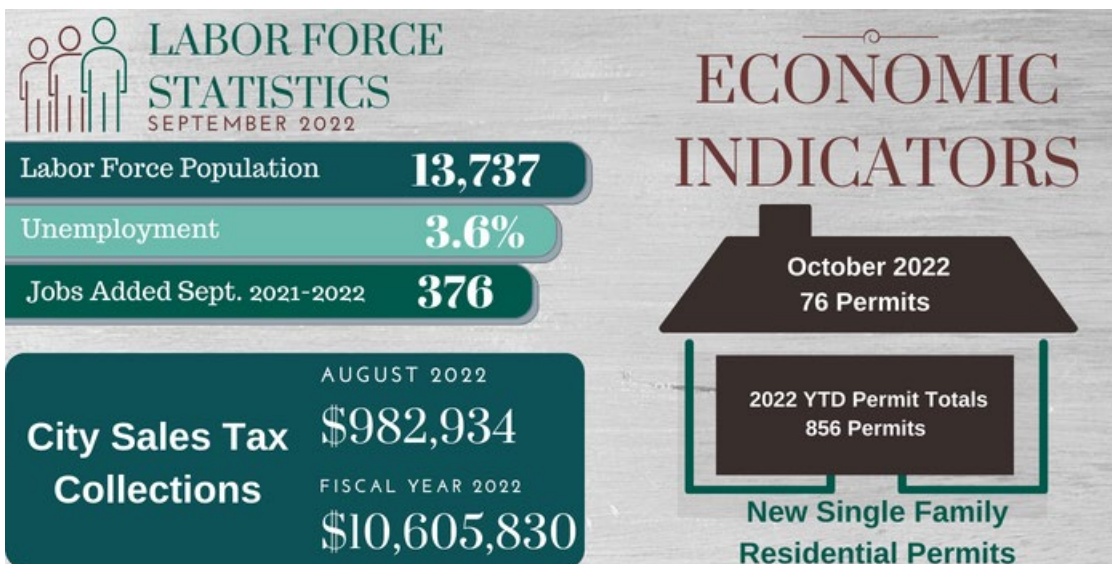
