# San Antonio Economic Indicators

The San Antonio Business-Cycle Index weakened slightly in January. While the unemployment rate ticked down, jobs contracted. Payroll changes were mixed across industries. Local consumer spending declined in mid-February due to a strong winter storm. Home sales activity surged in January. The number of individuals currently hospitalized with COVID-19 continues to decrease after peaking in late January. **Read More** 

#### <u>Texas Manufacturing Activity</u> <u>Accelerates Sharply</u>

Texas factory activity expanded at a markedly faster pace in March, according to business executives responding to the Texas Manufacturing Outlook Survey. The production index, a key measure of state manufacturing conditions, surged 28 points to 48.0, its highest reading in the survey's 17-year history. **Read More**
