Multimillion-dollar construction and renovation projects got the go-ahead to help improve the city of Seguin in 2020. Seguin's wastewater treatment plant and Walnut Springs trail expansion projects are big-ticket items on the city's budget. Carrying with it a hefty price tag to more efficiently carry waste across the city, Seguin leadership moved forward this year with plans for a \$184 million renovation of its wastewater treatment facility. San Antonio Economic Indicators

In October, the San Antonio Business-Cycle Index rebounded from its decline in September. The unemployment rate ticked down as recent job numbers improved. Local consumer spending improved in early November, while the number of small businesses open has been declining since late October. Stock prices of San Antonio-based companies rose over the five weeks ending Nov. 27. [Read More](#)

Texas Manufacturing Activity Expands at a Faster Pace

Expansion in Texas factory activity picked up in December, according to business executives responding to the Texas Manufacturing Outlook Survey. The production index, a key measure of state manufacturing conditions, rebounded from 7.2 to 25.5, indicating an acceleration in output growth.

Other measures of manufacturing activity also point to stronger growth this month. The new orders index pushed up 11 points to 17.8, and the growth rate of orders index rose from 9.7 to 16.5. The capacity utilization index moved up 11 points to 17.7, and the shipments index advanced from 13.7 to 21.9. [Read More](#)
